




-Could you tell us about the events you organized for the victory of Alpha Conde?

As you know, the people were motivated to show their support and happiness for the Alpha Conde election.

-What were the programs for the event?

In the daytime we had the convention. We invited many guests, personalities, and leaders of communities. The main purpose was a call for unity, development, and investment in our country in regards to schools, hospitals, and other issues. We also want to teach our kids the good culture of patriotism.

-During the event, your association rewarded some people from your community. Could you tell us more?

Our association decided to reward the people who have helped the association and have sacrificed their time for the community.

They've shown their support for the people from our community.

-How many people have been rewarded?

About twelve people, including myself as president of the Mandingo association, have been rewarded; I have been rewarded twice. Jose Toure is one of the best Afro-American promoters, promoting many African celebrities in the United States. He has just opened a beautiful night club in the Bronx named Capitol. Here, he tells us about it.

## As a promoter, what was your motivation for opening a club?

In August 2010 my club, Capitol, opened as one of the few African clubs in New York. Capitol has a capacity for more than 500 people, with six VIP areas as well as a good quality and respectable staff. I could say it's the most beautiful African club in New York. So far, we have had good reception.

#### How have people welcomed this new club?

Since we opened, people have come in and given great feedback. We've had African artists perform and have had visits from politicians, so people do love Capitol.

## -Who are your clients?

-African, Caribbean, and even Americans who love African music. We have very classic clients.

#### -What is your management strategy?

I have a managing team whose strategy is to focus on the street promotion, as well as internet, TV, magazines, radio broadcasting in the city from Ivoirtv.net, Afro Market Magazine, Le Griot, and the City College radio station, plus many more.

## -What days of the week is Capitol open?

We are open Saturday and Sunday for international African music and Wednesday through Friday for Caribbean music.




Reception offerte par le Representant Permanent du Tchad aupres des Nations Unies 11 ET 15 Janvier 2011 a New York

- 1) Je suis très satisfait. Nous avons été honorés de la présence des représentants de plus des 2/3 des Etats membres des Nations Unies accompagnés de leurs épouses. Ils ont fait le déplacement en dépit de la chute de la neige sur New York. Ma satisfaction est d'autant grande que les représentants des pays frères et amis, ainsi que l'échantillon représentant les tchadiens de New York, ont partagé avec nous notre joie bien au delà du temps prévu pour la réception.
- 2) L'instabilité chronique de notre pays aurait pu lui faire perdre sa place sur la scène internationale. # TCHAD: 50 YEARS OF D'INDEPENDENCE



Gentlemen.

I would like first of all to thank you for having accepted our invitation. My thanks to you all, Chadians and friends of Chad: Americans and other nationalities here present, Thank you also to the President of the Chadian's Group of contact for the fine words which he has just addressed to me.

Dear Guests, Our country Chad celebrates the fiftieth anniversary of its acquired independence on August 11, 1960. This is why we are linked here to celebrate this event like the example of our compatriots in our country and those which live like us outside. We are joined together not only to drive out the forces of the evil which destroyed our country, but more especially to express our hopes for a better future. The President of the Republic, His Excellence IDRISS DEBY ITNO, hoped for such a future when he proclaimed the year 2011, year of the beginning of the rebirth of the country. Because the country comes by far Indeed there is place to hope that our painful marked history of wars, destructions, slaughters, violation of all our rights and of tender to all the forms of suffering, the place yields to one new era of peace, of sincere national reconciliation, the consolidation of the State of right and Democracy, as well as economic and social development. Our hopes are founded on the confidence which we make with the genius of our people which inspired our political actors of goodwill to take saving actions in spite of our misfortunes so that our country, Chad, remains plain and upright and occupies the place which returns to him among the free and independent Nations. Yes, there is place to hope that our country will know from now a final peace, indispensable condition with its economic and social development, with the consolidation of the State of right and democracy. With the Political agreement of August 13 and the various agreements of reconciliation, we hope that the political actors of our country deposited the weapons definitively and decided to use the vote for the conquest of the power. Instead of a longer speech I would like to conclude on a predilection: it is said that those who know the sufferings of the War know how to avoid it to build Peace. The Chadians are those there. But before ending my matter, I would like to thank our festivity committee which made it possible the Embassy to organize this celebration. I would like to also encourage the group of contact, a more or less representative group, opened with those which are not recognized there, with going from before organizing the Chadians of New York and from the surroundings in an association for the defense of their material and moral rights in United States. The Mission will help them as it is possible, but it will not be able to replace our compatriots. Happy New Year and Better Wishes for all-Prosperity and real and lasting Peace for Chad! Chad forever! I Thank you.





Mariko has also talked about the privatization of the societies in Mali in the detriment of the local organization. The lack of factories to transform the country's main products as cotton and gold and tobacco has not been resolved yet. Many other aspects of development during the conference arose. 

The very charismatic Mouctar Diallo, president of "Nouvelles Forces Démocratiques (NFD), met with Guinean communities, located in the NYC area, in Queens on February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2011. It was the first US visit for the man who is considered one of the youngest and most auda-

cious politicians in Guinea, as well as a defender and activist of Guinean human rights.


Hundreds of people attended the meeting, including community and association leaders, as well as government members. After a brief welcome presentation by Dr. Thierno Diallo, Mouctar Diallo thanked the people for coming. He expressed his profound gratitude for his warm welcome. During his speech, he presented his program for change, and called for the diaspora to adhere to it and propose other ways to bring change to Guinea. Before Mouctar, the previous government did not include Guinean people in the US from. They never created a system to implement them in the developmental process, nor facilitate their return as well as their goods back in their home country. Mouctar also talked about the September 28<sup>th</sup> massacre in the stadium (28 Septembre the name of the stadium in Guinea) He has strongly condemned the impunity, and hopes that justice prevails. Many other issues related to the violation of human rights and development arose. Diallo introduced his wife who has been a key element in his life. Mouctar was accompanied with his political team including Etienne Soropogui, Oumou Salimata Keita, Mme Sylla Aissata,

UPR members and many other political parties and guests. It was a great moment in the exchange of ideas and a political dynamic meeting for Guinean people that will always be in the memory of Guinean people in the US.
